## PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT

### Development Permit

Check with the Planning & Development Team to see if you require a permit for:

- excavation or stockpile;
- building or an addition;
- change of use of land or building (ie. new business or change of one business to another type of business);
- change in intensity (ie. use of single family home to a business or multi-family home);
- placement of refuse or waste material on lands;
- use of land for storage or repair of motor vehicles or other machinery;
- demolition or removal of a building;
- placement of an already constructed or partially constructed building (ie. sheds over 10' on one side/ mobile home);
- landscaping where grades/drainage may be affected;
- decks higher than 2 feet above ground;
- home occupation (major or minor);
- fence;
- signs.

## PARKS & RECREATION



In mid March the Town Council decided to close all recreation facilities and playgrounds for 30 day to mitigate the spread of COVID-19. Since then the Province has declared a State of Public Health Emergency and the closure of these facilities now falls under their authority. All recreation facilities and playgrounds will stay closed until further notice.

## Town of St. Paul Bylaw # 2019-02 - Fire Department Bylaw

### Construction of a Fire Pit:

- Pits shall be at least 3 meters (10 Feet) from any combustible structures including fences or decks.
- There shall be no overhead wires, clotheslines or tree branches.
- Pits shall be constructed of non-combustible materials.
- The base of the pit shall rest on sand, gravel or concrete.
- Fire pits should be less than 1 meter (39 inches) in diameter and depth.
- All fire pits shall have a metal screen spark guard cover while in use.

### Using your Fire Pit:

- Do not burn garbage, lawn clippings, branches, leaves or yard refuse in your pit.
- Use only dry, clean firewood. No treated lumber scraps.
- Keep your fire small. No bonfires.
- Respect your neighbors. Make sure smoke is going straight up.
- Fire pits shall be used for cooking or warming purposes only.

### Safety Points:

- Adult supervision at all times.
- Keep screen cover in place except to add wood.
- Keep a water hose or pail nearby.
- Make sure your fire is out when you leave it.
- Again, keep your fire small.
