How do I know if a Gas Permit is required for my project?

These are some of the projects that require a permit in a residential situation:

- New furnace
- New water tank or replacement of a water tank (if there is changes to venting/piping)
- Change from a water tank to an instantaneous or tankless or on-demand water heater
- New fireplace
- New dryer or replacement (if there is changes to a line)
- New range or replacement (if there is changes to a line)
- New boiler
- New secondary risers

If you are hiring a contractor, homeowners are encouraged to ask for a copy of the issued permit before work is started. If work has already started, it's still not too late to apply!

The permit fee covers the following:

- any code related questions (by homeowner and/or contractor),
- inspection(s), and
- final notice called a Permit Services Report (PSR) to verify that the installation is complete and complies with the current code.
