How do I know if a Building Permit is required for my project?

Building permits are required for most renovations and construction projects some examples are:

- constructing a new building or structure (dwelling, detached garage, deck),
- alterations, additions or repairs to an existing building and or structure (covered deck, hot tub, install sign),
- constructing interior structural renovations (basement),
- demolish or relocate a building or structure, or
- changing the use/occupancy of an existing commercial building (ex: from office to retail).

Building permits are not required for minor repairs and replacements that do not affect the structural integrity of a building some examples are:

- cosmetic changes such as painting or changing flooring,
- installing cabinets,
- re-siding your home,

- replacing doors and windows as long as they are the same size, or
- roofing repairs or shingling.

If you are hiring a contractor, homeowners are encouraged to ask for a copy of the issued permit **before** work is started. If work has already started, it's still not too late to apply!

The permit fee covers the following:

- any code related questions (by homeowner and/or contractor),
- inspection(s), and
- Permit Services Report (PSR) to verify that the installation is complete and complies with the current code and ensure safety prior to use.

A development permit may first be required, before applying for a building permit. If you are unsure if you need a development permit contact Planning & Legislative Services.

MUNICIPAL ENFORCEMENT

With the onset of the nicer temperatures St. Paul Municipal Enforcement is seeing an increase in domestic animal related calls for service. The term 'domestic animals' refers to mainly dogs and cats. These animals/pets are the responsibility of ALL owners to ensure that all pets are kept in accordance with the Town of St. Paul Bylaws. It is important to familiarize yourselves with the Bylaw and ensure that you are compliant. Pet owners must not allow their pets to be at large, pet owners must pick up after their pets both in public and private areas and all pets must be registered with the Town of St. Paul.

Additionally, St. Paul Municipal Enforcement strongly advises residents, "DO NOT FEED STRAY ANIMALS". Should you feel the need to do this, you are essentially taking responsibility for that animal, and as such you then must adhere to the Town of St. Paul Dog & Cat bylaw requirements. Should you feed them, it is inevitable they will continue to come to your residence.

Another important point St. Paul Municipal Enforcement wishes to remind residents is that when a cat or dog is caught while at large, the local Shelter is not always able to accommodate housing the animal in their facility. If the shelter has reached the maximum allowable occupancy, or the animal is feral, sick, etc. we have no other place to house them.
